**Must** be accompanied into the centre by a responsible parent/guardian (16 years or older) and constantly actively supervised. Parents/guardians must position themselves to have a clear view of the child with no physical or structural barriers between them and the child/children and must wear a yellow wrist band that will be provided upon entry at reception.

# Mrs Howard's Farewell Speech (1)

It is lovely to see all the students', parents and staff who have come along today.

I started at Campbellfield Heights Primary School in July 2006 as the Assistant Principal and loved the school from my first day. In 2013 I was appointed principal.

I took leave last year due to a severe back injury. The first 6 months were terrible, and I missed CHPS so much. I was unable to do much at all; sitting on the couch knitting and a little bit of walking was all I could manage. Maybe my injury was sent as a message to slow down. Being a principal involves long days at school. I think without this injury I may have been working until I was 80, as all I have known and loved is working in schools with students, staff, and parents.

There are 4 main groups of people that make up a school Community:

1. Students
2. Staff
3. Parents
4. Local Community

## **Students:**

The students at CHPS have always been my number one priority. I am proud of them and have been so thrilled to see them develop over the years. Celebrating their first 100 days of school, staying at school over night for their first sleep over, going on camps with them, supporting them during NAPLAN and having amazing discussions with them on yard duty. I have also had the pleasure of seeing students learning. I loved how excited and proud they were to show me their work. I am proud of the relationship I built with students and loved every interaction I had with them. Even when having difficult discussions with some of the students over the years, these discussions were always respectful and ended with a chance for a fresh start. I was so proud of all the students' efforts during remote learning. What a difficult time this was, but the students stood up and learnt new skills in IT and tried their best to continue their learning at home. I do remember having to phoning students or going to their house to encourage them to do their work (I won't mention any names, as I understand what unprecedented times these were)

## Mrs Howard's Farewell Speech (2)

### **Staff:**

I have the privilege of leading and working alongside amazing staff members, leadership, teachers, Educational Support, and office staff. Staff at CHPS have always had the students' best interest at heart and go above and beyond to support them. They care and want to see all the students grow and achieve. Leaders are only as good as the people who surround us. The things that make this school special are the people. We have had so much fun and success over the years and those memories will remain in my heart forever. I am so grateful and proud of them all.

### **I have been surrounded by:**

**Teachers** who see their work as their vocation NOT as a job, they put in many hours outside school hours, thinking, reading, and planning to cater for all students in their care. Teachers have supported the school's vision and follow our values of 'Respect, Responsibility, Success, and Safety and instil these values into our students. Our teachers truly care for the students and their families. I am proud of all of them. I was with teachers as they grappled at the beginning of remote teaching. They were so determined to keep on teaching at a high standard, even if it had to be over a computer screen. Some of us were embarrassed at how we looked on video, but at the end of the day we were there for the students, not matter how we looked. I am also proud of the many teachers who started at CHPS as teachers and are now themselves in leadership positions at our school and other schools. I have learnt so much with and from my staff over the many years.

**Education Support Staff (ESs)** have supported me, the teachers, students, and our families. I know and appreciate how valuable they are. Some of our support staff work in classrooms, ensuring the students have extra support where required. I know the teachers and I value their help and support every day.

Other ESs work tirelessly outside the classroom providing wellbeing support, organising assessments, and bringing in outside agencies to help teachers cater for students that require this additional support. ESs work in the Office and have supported me over many years. I have appreciated their knowledge and with their help have kept the school financial and SAFE – OHS being very important. ESs working in our canteen and providing breakfast for the students.

ESs working in the HUB, ensuring support for our community members, to attend playgroup, English Classes and Social Events. ESs working everywhere.

All Education Support Staff are here to help students, teachers and families and I am proud of them and of what we have all achieved together.

I had the privilege to know many parents throughout the years, from the first day they dropped their child off to start Prep to seeing them being so proud at grade 6 graduation and then with their other children, going through the same process.
